The day's festivities include the Hambo Hat Contest, where the most creative and fashionable hats win prizes, displaying the event's elegance and pageantry. Additionally, the Hambletonian Oaks Final for fillies occurs, spotlighting the leading ladies of the sport and their swift, graceful performances.

As the trotters line up, anticipation surges among the crowd, eager for a day of electrifying races and enduring memories at the historic Meadowlands. The Hambletonian does not just signify a race; it heralds a new chapter in the storied saga of harness racing, a celebration of the sport's enduring legacy and excitement.



RACING THROUGH TIME

SARATOGA'S MIDSUMMER DERBY

As the summer wanes, the historic Saratoga Racecourse in New York prepares for a day etched in tradition, the 155th Travers Stakes. Scheduled for Saturday, August 24, 2024, this revered event, known as the "Midsummer Derby," ranks as the oldest premier thoroughbred horse race in the United States, a title it has proudly held since 1864.

THE TRAVERS STAKES

Named after William R. Travers, the first president of the Saratoga Racecourse, has seen the triumphs of legends and the heartbreaks of champions. The inaugural race saw victory claimed by a horse fittingly called Kentucky, belonging to Travers, establishing a tradition of memorable triumphs that would continue for years.

The honor roll features racing giants like American Pharoah, Whirlaway, and the legendary Man o' War. Whirlaway ranks as the unmatched champion who clinched the American Triple Crown and the Travers Stakes, a distinction that enshrines him in racing history. In 2023, Arcangelo joined these ranks of greatness, with Javier Castellano skillfully leading him to a triumphant win.

The Travers Stakes brims with unexpected tales, including the most memorable upset in 1930, when underdog Jim Dandy triumphed over Triple Crown winner Gallant Fox, a moment now etched in the race's lore. Since 1961, a unique tradition immortalizes the Travers winner's colors on a canoe adorning the infield pond, standing as a visual homage to past champions.

Additionally, the victor receives a meticulously crafted blanket of red and white carnations, reflecting the hues of Saratoga Racetrack from the skilled hands of a local florist.

Saratoga Racecourse, known as the "Graveyard of Champions" for its stunning upsets, is where the unthinkable often happens. The winner of the Travers Stakes receives the Man o' War Cup, a gold-plated trophy from Tiffany & Co., passed on by the Riddle family, descendants of Man o' War's owners.

The Travers Stakes, ranking just behind the Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes for American three-year-olds, highlights its prestige with a purse that reached \$1,600,000 in 2015, a testament to its importance, further underscored by American Pharoah's participation.

The Travers Stakes continues to be a summer spectacle, celebrating the best 3-year-olds in the nation and maintaining its status as a quintessential American racing event. With the 155th race on the horizon, anticipation builds as Saratoga prepares to create more history on its legendary track.



GOLDEN HOOVES ON THE PACIFIC SHORE

DEL MAR'S SUMMER SPECTACLE

The Pacific Classic at Del Mar Racetrack is a beacon of tradition and glory, where the summer sunbathes the track in a golden glow. On August 31, 2024, excitement will fill the air as the crème de la crème of long-distance dirt horses assemble.

More than just a competition, the Pacific Classic is a portal to immortality, offering a "Win and You're In" berth for the Longines Breeders' Cup Classic, complete with an all-expenses-paid chance to compete for the \$7 million purse.

Since its debut on August 10, 1991, the Pacific Classic has ascended to the zenith of the Del Mar racing calendar. Best Pal, crowned California Horse of the Year in 1990, set a lofty standard with his initial triumph. The roster of champions reads like an equine aristocracy's who is who. California Chrome, the 2016 victor, made history as the first Kentucky Derby winner to capture the Pacific Classic. Beholder claimed her spot in racing lore as the only filly or mare to triumph, securing her place in the Racing Hall of Fame with her 2015 victory.

The event has displayed remarkable consistency, with stalwarts like Tinner's Way, Skimming, and Richard's Kid securing consecutive titles. Flightline and Accelerate stand out as legends; each won the Pacific Classic and Breeders' Cup Classic within the same year.

The Pacific Classic transcends being a mere seasonal highlight; it embodies the enduring spirit and electrifying allure of horse racing. It is a spectacle that entralls spectators, a tradition that reveres the sport's rich tapestry, and a summons that resonates with every contender's soul. As the saga of the race endures, it continues to shine as a paragon of excellence, drawing crowds from all corners to partake in the drama that unfolds on Del Mar's storied dirt track.

GALLOP TO GLORY



THE 2024 CANADIAN TRIPLE CROWN JOURNEY



During 2024, the Canadian Triple Crown beckons the country's bravest Thoroughbreds to compete for glory. The series, steeped in tradition, kicks off with the King's Plate at Woodbine Racecourse in Ontario on August 17. The King's Plate, dating back to 1860 and formerly known as the Queen's Plate, adopted its new name following King Charles III's rise to the throne in 2022. It stands as North America's oldest continuous race. Welcoming 3-year-old Thoroughbreds born in Canada, the King's Plate transcends mere racing; it is a cultural mosaic, celebrating food, fashion, and entertainment, and rewards the victor with 50 guineas from the British crown.

The journey through the Triple Crown then leads to the Prince of Wales Stakes, the second jewel with its storied past. Scheduled for September 10, 2024, at the picturesque Fort Erie Racetrack, this race has been a fixture since 1929. Known for its historic charm, Fort Erie sets the stage for three-year-old Canadian-bred horses to battle over 1900 meters (about 1.18 mi) of dirt, continuing a legacy that began at the now-defunct Thorncliffe Park Raceway.

The Breeders' Stakes, the climactic finale of the Canadian Triple Crown, will ignite the turf at Woodbine Racecourse on September 29, 2024, at 1:10 P.M. Named in honor of E.P. Taylor, the esteemed Canadian tycoon and horse breeder, the race is a grueling 1 1/2-mile challenge on the E.P. Taylor Turf Course. It is the ultimate trial for the three-year-old contenders, testing their speed and ability to adapt to varying tracks and conditions. Since its inception in 1889, the Breeders' Stakes has been more than a race; it is a festive celebration of Canada's horse racing tradition. As the series progresses, it serves as a dynamic tribute to the enduring legacy of the sport, honoring only the most adaptable and resilient champions.

CHAMPIONS OF THE TURF

THE ESSENCE OF THE ARC

On the first Sunday of October, the heart of Paris beats to the rhythm of galloping hooves as the prestigious Prix d'Arc de Triomphe unfolds at the Longchamp Racecourse. This year, on October 6, 2024, the storied event celebrates another chapter in its illustrious history, which began on a cold October day back in 1920.

Known affectionately among racing enthusiasts as "the Arc," this Group 1 flat horse race is the pinnacle of French thoroughbred racing, open only to the finest three-year-olds and up, with geldings notably absent from the lineup. The Arc's reputation as the world's most prestigious all-aged horse race is not just a title; it is a testament to the extraordinary display of stamina and speed required to conquer its 2,400-metre course.

The track at Longchamp, right-handed and graced with turf, presents a formidable challenge that has become a rite of passage for the equine elite. With a purse that reached €5,000,000 as of 2022, making it the fifth-richest turf race globally, the stakes are as high as the spirits of the over 60,000 visitors who flock to witness this grand spectacle each year.

The Arc is more than just a race; it is a tribute to the heritage of French thoroughbreds. It was created to complement the Grand Prix de Paris and named after the Arc de Triomphe, a symbol of conquest and glory.

The first race was a spectacle that saw Comrade, a young three-year-old colt owned by Evremond de Saint-Alary, emerge as the victor, paving the way for the many legends that would follow in his hoofprints.

In recent years, horses like Ace Impact, Alpinista, and Torquator Tasso have etched their names into the annals of the Arc, each victory a story of heart and heroism. The race weekend transforms Paris, offering a range of ticketing and hospitality options that cater to every visitor, from those taking a casual interest to the most discerning horse racing connoisseurs.

As the Prix d'Arc de Triomphe continues to galvanize the world of horse racing, it remains a beacon of excellence, uniting fans and participants in a shared experience that transcends time and place, all under the watchful gaze of the Parisian sky.



REGULATING THE WAGER

THE UK'S GAMBLE ON AFFORDABILITY CHECKS

Amid the British summer, the UK government is gearing up for a regulatory shift to protect its citizens from gambling's financial dangers. It plans to roll out affordability checks to prevent excessive betting. The Gambling Commission is balancing consumer safety with industry health and is refining these checks through consultations, set to start in late August.

The new regulations target early detection of financial strain in gamblers. They introduce two tiers of checks to gauge financial vulnerability. The first tier unfolds if a gambler's net loss reaches £125 in a month or £500 over a year, employing public data for financial assessments. Should these checks flag no issues, the gambler gets a pass for the following year. However, heftier losses will initiate more intensive credit evaluations, with gamblers under 25 facing these checks more rigorously.

These measures aim to foster responsible gambling but have raised alarms in the racing industry over a possible £60 million deficit from lower levies and media rights, questioning the future of racecourses. Industry insiders worry the checks might push gamblers to less regulated offshore platforms.

Offshore racebooks, unbound by these stringent checks, stand to benefit from the new regulations. They provide bettors with fewer restrictions, enhanced privacy, more favorable odds, and a broader array of betting options. These platforms thrive on relaxed regulations, reduced operational costs, and access to a worldwide customer base, all while taking advantage of more favorable environments.

These entities might draw UK bettors seeking a less regulated experience. They appeal to those who find the new checks too tight, offering anonymity, diverse bets, and mobile convenience.

A PILOT SCHEME STARTING AT AUGUST'S END WILL TEST THE AFFORDABILITY CHECKS.

The Gambling Commission will monitor the impact and tweak thresholds and methods as needed. An interim code sets a £25,000 net deposit threshold for financial proof, pending a permanent solution post-pilot.

The new law is set to revolutionize consumer safety, polish the gambling industry's reputation, and pave the way for a more responsible gambling scene. Insights gleaned from the data collected through these checks promise to shape strategies that protect consumers better. As these changes take hold, they will send waves through the finance and tech industries, which will have to pivot to keep up with the new standards.

The UK's pioneering approach might become the template for gambling regulations worldwide, setting the stage for a global shift towards more conscientious betting practices.

The UK's affordability checks seek to make gambling safer and more responsible, but they also open doors for offshore racebooks and bettors. This complex mix of regulation, protection, and industry change could reshape the gambling scene in the UK and beyond. The next few months are the key to assessing these measures' effects and the future of the gambling and racing industries.
